

Here are the milestones SickKids Foundation has achieved over the past five years (2004/05 to 2008/09) thanks to the support of our donors:

- SickKids Foundation reaches target of \$500 million, 20 months ahead of schedule
- \$5.7 million in clinical and research equipment purchased including everything from a \$300 rocking chair for the hospital's burns unit to a \$900,000 PET Machine used in detecting cancer. Here is small sample of the equipment SickKids Foundation has helped purchase over the past five years:

- In the past five years, an investment in highest priority needs at SickKids has helped fund a number of critical initiatives (note: this is just a small sample of what has been funded with donor dollars):
 - Emergency Department Renovation
 - Operating Suites redevelopment including the construction of a new OR suite
 - Simulation Centre in the Learning Institute
 - Echocardiogram, a test where ultrasound is used to examine the heart
 - Incubators for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

 - The creation of a Paediatric Academic Multi-Organ Transplant (PAMOT) step-down unit, a recovery area within the hospital for patients who have just received a transplant
 - Stroke research

- Patient amenities assistance, helping SickKids patients and their families with expenses not covered by insurance including parking, an overnight stay or essential drugs
 - Portable Echo machines
 - Transonic Flow
 - IGT Clinic Ultrasound
 - Beds and stretchers
 - DNA Engine
 - Centrifuge
- HealthyKids International was established to address children's health-care needs on a global level
- Through our national initiatives \$17.7 million has been invested across Canada in the past five years including grants to researchers at a critical early stage in their careers and addressing areas where there are gaps in knowledge
- \$8.5 million has gone towards fellowships, research chairs, clinical students, bursaries and training as we continue to try to attract the brightest health-care professional from around the world
- \$5.2 million helped fund Safe Kids Canada, the national injury prevention program of SickKids
- \$4.6 million contributed to the international patient program at SickKids, allowing SickKids to treat patients from around the world who otherwise wouldn't have access to this level of care
- \$35 million went towards keeping our SickKids researchers in spaces necessary for their work in stem cells, cancer, diabetes and autism

Fundraising highlights from 2004 to 2009:

- Our Miracle Club Members who donate on average \$18/month, generated \$88 million of unrestricted funding – proving they are the backbone of SickKids Foundation.
- More than 4,000 events were held ranging from lemonade stands to galas, raising a total of \$49 million, reflecting the overwhelming support and generosity of the community.
- SickKids Foundation has partnerships with some of the top corporations in Canada. These relationships – developed philanthropically, through marketing initiatives or through membership in the Children's Miracle Network – raised \$77 million for The Hospital for Sick Children.
- SickKids Foundation announced a \$2 million gift from Gerald Schwartz and Heather Reisman to establish the Schwartz-Reisman SickKids Exchange Program with Israel expanding the opportunity for paediatric specialists from Israel to train at SickKids.
- Newly renovated Plastic Surgery Clinic opens at SickKids thanks to a \$500,000 gift from KRG's Children's Charitable Foundation. The modernized clinic

provides a more welcoming environment for patients treated by the Burns, Plastics and Craniofacial programs.

- The newly renovated Marnie's Rainbow Lounge opened. The new space offers patients a place where they can just be kids through new computers, music players, movies, a full-size pool table and a new kitchen. Mattamy Homes Limited donated \$390,000 for the space.
- Arthur and Sonia Labatt donated an historic \$30 million to SickKids to establish The Labatt Family Heart Centre providing a world-class facility and care to children with congenital heart disease; \$5 million from this gift supported the Arthur and Sonia Labatt Brain Tumor Research Centre.
- Dr. Andrew Redington was named the BMO Financial Group Chair in Cardiology. The \$2 million gift from BMO Financial Group supports the research of current and future heads of the Division of Cardiology at SickKids.
- SickKids opened a state-of-the-art cardiac diagnostic and interventional unit (CDIU) thanks in large part to a \$3 million gift from Mitchell Goldhar. The Mitchell Goldhar CDIU has enabled Canada's largest paediatric interventional catheterization program to develop new innovations in minimally invasive alternatives to open-heart surgery. Other major donors to the unit with gifts of more than \$1 million or more included: Gary Slaight and Standard Broadcasting Corporation and their listeners, Ruth and Douglas Grant, David and Judy Galloway, Jennifer Ivey Bannock and the Richard Ivey Foundation.
- SickKids opens a new Hollywood theatre thanks to the overwhelming support of Barry Avrich and the Toronto film community. A much-needed escape for hospitalized children, the 230-seat theatre creates an industry standard movie experience for patients and families.
- In June 2008, John and Mirna Daniels donated an additional \$250,000 and the theatre was renamed the John and Mirna Daniels Hollywood Theatre.
- Mental health research and outreach received a much-needed boost from the RBC Foundation. A \$2 million gift provided seed funding for new research into paediatric mental health as well as training opportunities in clinical research through fellowships.
- Friends of hockey legend Tie Domi showed their support by donating more than \$1 million in his name to fund a major renovation of the rehabilitation department at SickKids. 'The Friends of Tie Domi Rehabilitation Clinic' opened in May 2009.
- The efforts of the Birrell family to find a cure for neuroblastoma were recognized with the naming of a cancer research lab in their son's honour. 'The James Birrell Laboratories' at SickKids Research Institute reflects the impact of a young boy who inspired a community to donate more than \$2 million to find a cure for cancer.
- More than 200 children are celebrated at the Kids Believe in SickKids Gala each year. These young heroes are responsible for raising more than \$150,000 every

year, some collecting donations for SickKids in lieu of birthday or bar mitzvah gifts.

- Dr. Agnes Wong was announced as the inaugural recipient of the John and Melinda Thompson Chair in Vision Neuroscience based on a \$2 million gift from the Thompson family.
- The Ho Family donated \$2 million to SickKids to further research into autoimmune diseases. Dr. Earl Silverman is the inaugural recipient of the Ho Family Chair in Autoimmune Diseases.
- Mattamy Homes Limited donated \$500,000 to pain management research and education at SickKids.
- Ferrari reaffirmed its commitment to SickKids by making a transformational gift of \$1 million to the Operating Suites Redevelopment Project.
