Giving talented early-career researchers across Canada the strong start they need so their discoveries can do the same for children and youth.



SOW THE SEEDS THAT WILL CHANGE LIVES

THE CHALLENGE

Children aren't small adults. Their needs are different, and the changes they undergo from infancy to early adulthood are vast. To overcome today's biggest challenges in child health, Canada needs paediatric health researchers who work to find new ways to diagnose, treat, predict, and prevent diseases of childhood and adolescence. Out-of-the-box thinking often comes early in a scientist's career, but it's the hardest time to secure funding. On average, just 15% of scientists who apply to the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) succeed; about 80% of the funding goes to senior researchers.

WHY SICKKIDS

SickKids Foundation and CIHR founded the national New Investigator Research Grant program in 2001. Since then, we've invested more than \$35 million in New Investigator Research Grants for 194 researchers at 51 health institutions across Canada. Our grantees have become leaders in child healthcare. Most go on to head up research programs and clinical divisions. They repay the early investment many times over with high-impact discoveries, outstanding research leadership, and by mentoring the next generation of game changers.

OUR VISION

To be Canada's premier national granting program for early-career paediatric health researchers, setting them on the path to competitiveness, productivity, and research breakthroughs. This peer-reviewed program funds research in the lab, the clinic, and in response to gaps in health policy across the spectrum of childhood diseases: from asthma, allergy, and mental health to the most complex and rare of conditions.

Donor support is essential to help sustain this unique program.

WHAT IT WILL COST

Every year, we fund six new grantees. A gift of \$350,000 funds a New Investigator Research Grant, supporting the three-year project of one researcher. An investment of \$2 million funds the grant competition for a year, and an investment of \$10 million sustains the program for five years.
